

# GL11 Community Project

Press Release – June 2009

As part of its socio-economic development scheme, Magnox South Ltd have made an award of £25,000 to Cam and Dursley based community group GL11. Magnox South Ltd which manages and operates the Berkeley Nuclear Licensed Site in Gloucestershire has awarded this initial funding as part of a potential three year funding agreement which could see GL11 receive additional financial support. The Magnox South Ltd, socio-economic scheme aims to provide regional support to activities which benefit the social and economic life of communities living near each of its sites, or that produce other environmental benefits for such communities.

GL11 applied to the scheme in order to fund valuable community projects in the GL11 postcode area which covers Cam, Dursley and the surrounding district. GL11 offers a broad range of learning and education opportunities from one-off taster sessions to year-long accredited courses. Also provided are drop-in sessions which provide support, social and skill development for all age groups, activities and events throughout the year. These events are often in partnership with other local community based groups and national development agencies such as the Learning Skills Council.

Ann Wheeler, GL11 Project Manager said "To have been awarded these funds is a tremendous boost to everyone involved with GL11. I believe that the good work GL11 has undertaken since its formation in 2001 in supporting individuals, families and whole communities has been recognized through this grant. In 2009 we are developing outreach work in Uley, Stinchcombe, Coaley and North Nibley, and the financial support from Magnox South Ltd will support this specific programme of work, as well as underpin our continuing work for residents throughout the Cam and Dursley areas. We are looking forward very much to this year, and are most grateful for the support of Magnox South Ltd in enabling us to expand our delivery of services and activities to some of the more outlying communities within the GL11 postcode area.."
